Jim Orband's talk at the Williamsburg Public Library on Nov 13 on deer in the home landscape was eagerly received by an audience desperate for solutions. The good news is there are deer repellants on the market which Jim has found effective, as well as fencing. The bad news is, Jim told us, there really is no permanent deterrent. Deer are hungry, being forced from their feeding grounds by development, and are moving into housing areas. With no natural predators, and strict hunting laws, they will eat anything available. Check with your extension office (Jim is with York County) for specific advice about deer browse in your housing area.

HORTICULTURAL COMMITTEE

Currently, the Williamsburg Botanical Garden is a two-acre area in Freedom Park with no onsite water supply. However, when the Free Black settlement interpretative centers near completion, we should be receiving water and electricity in the next year or two. In the mean-time, watering is done from a water tank, by buckets and hoses and a sprinkler which requires the use of a pump, the property of John and Joanne Chapman.


Deer are regularly breaching the wire fence by breaking, or crawling over and under the wider openings. We are losing and have lost a significant number of tree seedlings, shrubs and herbaceous plants due to deer browse. The need for a permanent deer fence is imperative, as is the need for a chairman of the fund-raising committee and a spring event to generate the necessary funds. The Garden has been receiving donations of plants from interested citizens; without an overall landscaping plans, new plantings are going in wherever.

Recognizing the need for some coordination of additions and removals to the WBG, a group of garden workers met and drafted guidelines for a Horticultural Committee. The draft suggests that the Committee would oversee plantings to retain the integrity of the distinctive areas of the Garden, to avoid planting invasive, tropical and desert species, and to attempt to retain the gene-systems of mountain disjuncts in the surrounding areas of Freedom Park.
